Third Sunday of Easter

The Church remains closed during Mass time and is private for funerals. Otherwise, it is open from 10:30 am to 4:00 pm from Mon. to Sat. for individual visits and personal prayer. You may enter by the side door near the Sacristy. Please use the hand sanitiser, wear a face covering, and observe social distancing.

The letter box on the inner door of the Sacristy may be used to return collection envelopes and to arrange Masses for anniversaries and other intentions. We continue to celebrate Mass at the usual times but without a congregation. All Masses are streamed live. Funeral Masses may be recorded on request.

Sacrament of Baptism

We have received word from the Diocesan Office that Baptisms may be resumed on a controlled basis. We can take one family at a time but attendance must be limited to six persons. We hope this will be helpful to parishioners who have been waiting for some time to have children baptised. Please contact Fr. Tom Ryan or Fr. Des McAuliffe to make arrangements for Saturday at 5:00 pm or Sunday at 12:15 pm.

Covid-19 Vaccination

First round vaccination for people aged 70 years and older has been finished in some GP practices and is continuing in others. If you have not been called, you may ring your GP Surgery to check. If you cannot leave home, other arrangements can be made.

The online portal, at which persons aged 65 to 69 years may register for vaccination, is now open. To register online, you will need a mobile phone number, e-mail address, PPS number and Eircode. If you do not have these, you can register by telephone at the Covid-19 Helpline: 1850 24 1850. Further details may be found on the HSE website: www.hse.ie.

Those who are fully vaccinated for two weeks, from two households, may now meet each other indoors.

Coronavirus Restrictions

Since 12th April, all classes have returned to school; two households may meet outdoors but not in their gardens; we may travel within our county or within 20 km from home, if crossing into another county.

From 26th April, outdoor sports facilities and outdoor visitor attractions will be reopened; maximum attendance at funerals will be increased to 25.

The reopening of religious services from 4th May, on a phased basis, is under consideration. Full details may be found on the government website: www.gov.ie.
