REFLECTION ON JOHN WATERS VISIT:

Unpublished letter to Limerick Letter - Dear Editor,

On behalf of the pro-life people of Our Lady of the Rosary parish, Ennis Road, I want to take the opportunity, in the interest of justice and fairness, to correct inaccuracies in your report (L.L 30/4/18) on John Waters' talks at Masses in our parish on 28th/29th April last.

Firstly, John Waters did NOT make his comments "during" the Masses, as your paper claimed. He spoke at the end of each Mass. This was to facilitate parishioners who were not in a position to stay the extra 15 minutes for the talk.

Secondly, to say that John did not address the compassion issue was also incorrect. In fact, over 3 minutes of the 15-minute talk at the vigil Mass was given over to the issue. This is recorded on video.

Thirdly, while the report acknowledges that many parishioners approached John Waters to shake his hand and congratulate him after each talk, it failed to state that he received a mighty round of applause from the entire congregation and a standing ovation after at least one of the presentations. People felt he brought clarity to the Referendum debate, and it was this clarity that was the main talking point after all three Masses. John showed, in a language that was easily understood by all present, how our government, using euphemisms like "compassion", "reproduction rights", "right to choose", etc., is proposing something that would change Ireland forever – for the worse. The proposal is that we, the people, abolish the 'Right-to-life' and introduce the 'Right-to-kill'. He showed how, on the 25th May next the citizens of Ireland are being asked to (a) strike down an

existing INALIENABLE fundamental human right to life of the most innocent, most vulnerable, defenceless group in Irish society, and (b) at the same time hand over POWER to politicians to introduce the 'Right to Kill' as a fundamental human right. He emphasised that this is the first time in history that a "people" – not government – has been asked to vote in the Right to kill a particular group of persons in the state. Parliaments in other countries have done so the past, but the right to kill was never introduced by a vote of the people.
