



SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL:

John 10:11-18

1. Our relationship with those 'in charge' of us changes when we sense that not only are they in charge, but they care. Remember the difference this made for you as a child and give thanks for the caring adults who were part of your life.
2. The good shepherd 'lays down his life for the sheep'. When has your care for another led you to 'lay down your life' for that person, e.g., as a friend, parent, spouse, son or daughter? When have you known another do this for you?
3. Jesus speaks of the freedom of the Good Shepherd in laying down his life. Faced with the needs of others, we can at times feel trapped into looking after them, caught by duty, obligation, or guilt. We can become like the hired hands doing a job without care for the person. Perhaps you have experienced both attitudes, caring for others under duress and caring by your free choice. What difference did it make when you chose to care for the other, even in circumstances where you had little option?
4. What do these experiences of love and care in human relationships reveal to you about God's love for you?

STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

In 1993 the Sisters of Mercy presented the stained glass windows over the high altar to Our Lady of the Rosary parish. These windows were originally made by Mayer of Munich and installed in St Mary's Convent, Kings Island in 1885. They depict (from left to right): the biblical story of 'Suffer Little Children'; the Assumption and the Visitation Window of the Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary.

The stained-glass triptych on the sacristy side of the altar has a centre piece of the baptism of Christ by Evie Hone, the surrounding panels depicting the nativity and the resurrection are by John & Róisín Murphy.

On the Right-side aisle of the church, there are six stained glass windows. They depict (from the back of the church) the Resurrection, the Finding of Jesus in the Temple, the Holy Family, the Adoration of the Magi, the Betrothal of Mary and Joseph and the Annunciation. These windows came from the Abbey Stained Glass Company Dublin and were erected in 1979.
