# Church News

The Church remains closed during Mass times and is private for funeral services. All Masses are streamed live because of restrictions on attendance. We have Stations of the Cross after 10:00 am Mass on Fridays during Lent. Otherwise, the Church is open for individual visits and private prayer from 10:30 am to 4:00 pm, Monday to Saturday. Please use the side door by the Sacristy and observe Covid precautions.

Intentions are remembered at Masses, which are celebrated in Church, streamed online, and broadcast by parish radio. The letter box on the inner door of the Sacristy may be used to arrange Mass for an anniversary, a month's mind or other remembrance.

Collection Envelopes may also be returned through the letter box, which is protected by the Church security system and emptied every day.

Pope Francis has declared the Year of "Amoris Laetitia Family" starting on 19<sup>th</sup> March 2021, the Feast of St. Joseph. Speaking of it last Sunday as "a special year to grow in family love", he has asked for a renewed pastoral drive to place the family at the centre of attention for Church and for society.

#### Bishop St. Oscar Romero

On Wednesday, 24<sup>th</sup> March 2021, we remember Oscar Romero, Archbishop of San Salvador, who was shot dead on 24<sup>th</sup> March 1980 while celebrating Mass. An outspoken critic of violence from all sides of the conflict in El Salvador, he was an advocate for social justice. He defended the rights of the poor and the oppressed. In 2015, Bishop Romero was declared a martyr and beatified. In 2018, he was canonised.



#### Feast of the Annunciation

On Thursday, 25<sup>th</sup> March 2021, we celebrate The Annunciation of the Lord, when the Angel Gabriel announced to the Virgin Mary that she was chosen to be the Mother of the Son of God. Celebrated at this time for hundreds of years, it reminds us to be open to the Will of God in our lives, as Mary was in her life.

Once again, it is going to be difficult to distribute the collection envelopes to parishioners. They are now available in the Church, organised by area, some with the name of the usual distributor attached, some without.
