SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPELS John 14:15-21 21 May 2017

- 'If you love me you will keep my commandments', and specifically the commandment to love one another (cf. 13:34). How have you experienced the link between love of God and love of those around you?
- 2. Jesus is preparing his disciples for his imminent departure and for a future in which he would be with them in a different way. He would not 'leave them orphans' but send an 'Advocate' to 'be with (them) for ever'. How have you experienced the presence of God with you in your life?
- Perhaps you have also experienced the challenge of preparing another (a child, a friend) for a time when you would no longer be physically together. Recall how you gave the message of your ongoing support.
- 4. How have you experienced the presence and support of a loved one (parent, spouse, friend) when circumstances have separated you from them?
- 5. The proof of the ongoing presence of Jesus with his disciples is that 'I live and you will live.' Discipleship is about much more than rules and regulations. It is about being alive. How has discipleship helped you to be more fully alive?

Reason 5: Adoption, a positive

alternative: We can "Love Both" is through the promotion of adoption as an option in a crisis pregnancy. We say this with the utmost sensitivity and understanding of what a difficult and heroic act it is to give up your baby over for adoption. There are millions of lives saved because of adoption. One was Steve Jobs, Founder of Apple who testified to the importance of adoption in his life and the gratitude he had for his mother by saying 'I wanted to meet my biological mother, mostly to thank her, because I'm glad I didn't end up as an abortion. She was twenty three and she went through a lot to have me.' Just 7 babies were adopted in Ireland during 2015.

Reason 6: Stories of hope after rape We can love both is the case of pregnancy following rape. It's very important that we don't allow abortion to become the "default response" to pregnancy in these cases. The Rape Crisis Centre has carried out research that shows that 74% of women in Ireland who become pregnant after rape do not have an abortion.
