Caught up in her wonderment at being pregnant and the news that her cousin is also expecting, Mary hurries off as quickly as she can. Perhaps the journey gives her time to reflect on everything that is happening. The precious moment when Elizabeth greets her is a lovely glimpse of the close friendship between the two women.

We know that Elizabeth is advanced in years, and that she and her husband Zechariah had not expected to ever have a child. Through Mary's service towards others, through that encounter, our Lord's promise is renewed and makes it happen now, just as it did then.'

With just two days to go until Christmas it is a busy time. But it is also a time that offers many opportunities to reach out, whether it is to build bridges with family members, offer our time to someone who is lonely, or support a friend or neighbour who finds this time of year difficult.

BABY JESUS: This year the Parish coCuncil have decided to ask 3 / 4 families with small children to take Baby Jesus and each look after him for a night prior to Christmas Eve, when Baby Jesus will be returned to the crib in Our Lady of the Rosary church. We feel this will be a great way of including children in our Christmas Celebrations.

THE CRIB: Many years ago, in the thirteenth century, when most ordinary people could not read, St. Francis decided he would demonstrate the Christmas story in a way anyone could understand. He set up a stable scene in a cave not far from his home in Assisi, with real people and animals. As people gathered around to see what he was doing, he told them how Jesus had been born in a simple stable and how angels had appeared to shepherds telling them to go and find for themselves the Messiah who had been born. The idea gradually caught on and now the Christmas Crib (also called a creche or Nativity scene) is a universal part of the celebrations.

THE CANDLE OF LOVE: The fourth candle, the last purple candle, the 'candle of love' oftentimes called the 'Angels Candle,' is lit today. The angels announced the good news of a Saviour. God sent his only Son to earth to save us because he loves us.

On Christmas Eve, the white centre candle is traditionally lit. This candle is called the 'CHRIST CANDLE' and represents the life of Christ that has come into the world. The

colour white represents purity. Christ is the sinless, spotless, pure Saviour.
