THE DEEP END The power of forgiveness

'I bear no ill will. I bear no grudge. Dirty sort of talk is not going to bring her back to life. She's in heaven and we shall meet again. I will pray for these men tonight and every night' These words of Gordon Wilson echoed across the world, in 1987, just hours after his 20-yearold daughter Marie was killed in an IRA bomb in Enniskillen. Very few words in the history of Northern Ireland conflict had such a powerful impact. His extraordinary capacity to forgive the people who had caused him so much pain helped to move along the slow process.

Gordon Wilson was the personification of the words of Jesus: 'love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you' It is one of the most difficult and challenging passages in the Gospels: one commentator calls it 'Jesus' most unreasonable command'. Living under oppressive Roman rule, with torture and murder not uncommon, the disciples knew what it was to hate their enemies. As we read and listen to the news today, the cruelty of people continues to astound and upset us.

But Jesus reminds us that everyone is human. All are children of God, who 'causes his sun to rise on bad men as well as good.' While we clearly don't accept or excuse the terror and evil in the world, we cannot dehumanise those who carry out despicable actions. It is much easier said than done, but we must strive to meet hatred with love. With God, there is always forgiveness; there is always hope.

'Returning hate for hate multiples hate, adding deeper darkness to a night already devoid of stars. Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that.'
