Vocations Sunday

This Fourth Sunday of Easter is also designated as a Day of Prayer for Vocations. His Holiness, Pope Francis, has issued a message which highlights three features from the life of St. Joseph - dream, service and fidelity - as key words for individual vocations.

"The first is *dream*. Everyone dreams of finding fulfilment in life. We rightly nurture great hopes, lofty aspirations that ephemeral goals ... cannot satisfy. ... Saint Joseph has much to tell us in this regard, because, through the dreams that God inspired in him, he made of his life a gift."

Pope Francis writes on *service*: "The Gospels show how Joseph lived entirely for others and never for himself. ... Every true vocation is born of the gift of oneself, which is the fruit of mature sacrifice. The priesthood and consecrated life likewise require this kind of maturity."

He refers to the *fidelity* of Joseph in his daily perseverance, quietly serving God's plan. This fidelity is nurtured in light of God's faithfulness to us in our Christian vocation. Pope Francis mentions the words heard in a dream: "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid" and he says: "They are words you will hear anew, at every step of your vocation".

First Communion and Confirmation

The Bishop of Limerick has announced that the Sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation may be celebrated across the diocese from the beginning of July. This is subject to government guidelines but the Bishop expects that dates can now be set, at least provisionally, in each parish. Fr. Mc Auliffe has written to the parents of the children concerned through the schools.

Message from An Taoiseach

In a letter to Faith Leaders, dated 21st April 2021, Micheál Martin has written as follows:

"I fully acknowledge the concerns of faith leaders and share your wish for a safe return to public worship. It was for this reason that Government has already indicated that we would review the recommencement of public worship, along with a number of other sectors, from 4th May. The extent of that recommencement will be informed by public health advice. I can assure you that the Government, when it

meets next week, will give careful and positive consideration to reopening Places of Worship in May." [Extract]
