He goes on to suggest that when individuals, or groups, focus on Jesus there is an increase of energy and vitality. Have you seen this happen?
- 3. The parable also reminds us that we are not the source of our own life. It is a gift from God, from our parents, and from all who have nourished us. Give thanks for those who have been a source of life for you.
- 4. God is glorified by our being fruitful. When has human fruitfulness reminded you of God at work in our world?

POPE APPOINTS THREE LAY WOMEN TO CHURCH WATCHDOG

In an unprecedented move, Pope Francis has appointed three female academics as consultants to the Vatican's doctrinal watchdog, paving the way for women to have a more integral role in the Church's central administration.

The Vatican announced on April 21 that the Pontiff had named three women and two priests as consultants to the Congregation of the Doctrine of the Faith (CDF). The women are Dr Laetitia Calmeyn, lecturer of theology at the Collège des Bernardins in Paris, Dr Linda Ghisoni

and Dr Michelina Tenance, respectively Professor of Canon Law and Professor of Theology at Rome's Pontifical Gregorian University.

Dr Linda Ghisoni was appointed last year to head the laity section in the Vatican's Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life, while her fellow Italian Dr Tenace is a judge in the First Instance Court of the Vicariate of Rome.

She is a consecrated woman, as is Belgian Dr Calmeyn, who has in the past worked as a palliative care nurse and a religion teacher.

The historic new appointments mark the first time ever that women or laity have been appointed as consultants to the CDF.
