## Fifth Sunday of Easter

The government has just announced a significant easing of Covid-19 restrictions. From Monday 10<sup>th</sup> May, Churches will reopen for public worship with congregations of up to 50 people. As well as for daily and weekend Masses, this means that up to 50 may attend wedding ceremonies and funerals.

We are delighted to be able to welcome our parishioners into the Church once more but we must be ever vigilant. The coronavirus is still spreading in our community. The number of new cases being announced each day is quite high. Remember what happened in December. Let's be careful not to risk another wave of serious illness and death.

When you return to Church, please use the hand sanitisers and wear a face covering. Designated seating areas will be indicated as before. Please observe social distancing in and around the Church and remember to keep 2 metres back from others when approaching for Holy Communion.

While many of our parishioners have been vaccinated against Covid-19, others have only received the first dose and many are still waiting. We must continue to be careful especially in social gatherings.

For those who are unable to return to Church for the time being, we hope that you will join us online through the streaming service. Fr. Mc Auliffe intends to resume his monthly visits to those who are housebound from the beginning of May.

# **Edmund Ignatius Rice**

Born in Callan, Co. Kilkenny, in 1762, Edmund Rice became a successful businessman in Waterford. Following the death of his wife, Mary Elliot, in a tragic accident just a few years after they were married, Edmund Rice began a ministry to the poor by starting a school for boys. As he was joined by others in this work, he laid the foundations of a religious community, building a monastery and a school in 1802 at Mount Sion in Waterford City. In two classrooms of about 100 boys each, the main subjects were reading, writing, arithmetic and religion. Some pupils were also taught bookkeeping, geography and navigation.

In time, Edmund Rice had founded two recognised congregations, The Presentation Brothers and The Christian Brothers. He died in 1844 and he was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1996.
