THE DEEP END - 'The Elder Son'

Sometimes we can be so familiar with a Gospel passage we tend to switch off after the first few sentences. That would be a shame. especially when the Gospel is one of the great blockbuster parables. The real challenge in today's Gospel is what happens after the lost sonreturns. The elder brother has 'worked like a slave' all those years and is understandably upset. The Father's welcome of the vounger son would have been considered extremely foolish by those listening to this story. However, the Father makes it clear that his outreach to the younger brother will notchange his love for the older brother. It will cost the elder brother nothing to reach out. We have nothing to lose in welcoming home the lost.

Today, we can try to place ourselves somewhere in this narrative: where do you stand? This Gospel shows us that God returns the lost to the community, regardless of the boundaries that we might put in place. Jesus teaches us a lesson in radical hospitality. No matter how far we wander from home, God is still a loving God. The elder brother has a choice: to come to the party or to sulk in the corner. Luke, excellent story-teller that he is, leaves the reader to decide the outcome.

'God of love, show us our place in this world as channels of your love for all the creatures of this earth, for not one of them is forgotten in your sight. Enlighten those who possess power... that they may love the common good, advance the weak, and care for this world in which we live' (Pope Francis, Laudato Si, 246)

THE GARMENT OF SUFFERING:

Life is a journey that brings joy and happiness, but also pain, hurt, suffering and grief. Pain and hurt may come from the death of a loved one, broken relationship, living with an alcoholic, ill-health, abuse, unemployment etc. Each individual carries his/her own pain in life. For many pain, hurt and grief have never been healed. It is important to have an opportunity to OWN our own individual pain or hurt, and enter into a healing process.

Rituals provide healing. It is our hope that the ritual of the **GARMENT OF SUFFERING** will provide the opportunity for healing in our lives. Lent, when we reflect on the pain and suffering in the life of Jesus, gives us that opportunity to revisit our pain and grief.

Between now and Palm Sunday, we invite you to place a piece of cloth — about 4 inches square — in the basket at the foot of the altar, as a symbol of your suffering, pain, grief or hurt. During Holy Week, these patches will be sewn into the Garment of Suffering. This will be draped on the Cross on Good Friday — the symbol of grief being carried by the people of our Parish. It will be burned in the Paschal Fire on Holy Saturday night.
