#### Church News

We publish the Weekly Newsletter online and we are pleased to have received positive feedback from parishioners. Many of you are reading it from the website and some are printing copies for neighbours.

The Church remains closed during Mass times and is private for funeral services. All Masses are streamed live because of restrictions on attendance.

The Church is open for individual visits from 10:30 am to 4:00 pm, Monday to Saturday, except for times when funeral Masses are being celebrated.

Intentions are remembered at Masses, which are celebrated in Church, streamed online, and broadcast by parish radio. The letter box on the inner door of the Sacristy may be used to arrange Mass for an anniversary, a month's mind or other remembrance.

#### Easter 2021

As mentioned last week, the four Archbishops of the Catholic Church had a meeting with An Taoiseach, Micheál Martin, to discuss the current level of Covid-19 restrictions and the Church's desire to return to worship, in particular during the season of Lent and with the approach of Holy Week and Easter.

While recognising the spiritual comfort and hope that participation in public worship brings, it is also understood that gatherings for public ceremonies can only happen when considered safe in the prevailing circumstances. With infection levels still very high in the community, it seems likely that Easter Ceremonies will again be conducted online this year.
