Report on the Diocesan Assembly

On Saturday 4 October representatives of the Parish Council attended the Diocesan Assembly, which was attended by representatives of every parish in the diocese. Bishop Brendan welcomed all to the Assembly and the meeting began with an overview of the Jubilee Year with a video and photographs. There were reports and videos on many events including the Youth Pilgrimage to Rome, Monaleen Parish Retreat at Glenstal Abbey, International Women's Day conference.

The second part of the meeting was spent on looking forward. There was a discussion on the Consultation Process which Bishop Brendan is launching for every parish. Consultation sessions are to take place in all parishes in the coming weeks and parishes are asked to gather as many people as possible including those who might not regularly attend church, parents with young or teenage children, to explore how best to sustain the local faith community and how to shape the future of our parishes. The diocese will provide facilitators who will help to guide the conversations.

Bishop Brendan said that many features of parish life, that we grew up with and have become familiar with, are of the past and we need to have courage and vision to imagine new ways, new structures, new models suggested to us by the Holy Spirit. No decisions will be taken on the night but the feedback will be extremely important in shaping the future of our diocese. There was time during the day for reflection, discussion, proposals and questions.
