Ash Wednesday & Lent

On Wednesday next, 18 February, we begin the Season of Lent with our observance of Ash Wednesday. Traditionally marked by prayer and fasting, Lent is a time of preparation for Easter and of reflection upon the Resurrection. **Mass on Wednesday at 10:00 am.**

Having ashes blessed and applied to one's forehead is a long-standing tradition as a sign of our creation from dust and a symbol of penance. Ashes will be blessed and distributed at the 10:00 am Mass. Dry ashes will also be available for those who can take them to housebound parishioners. Just wet them at home before application to the forehead, saying these words.

Repent and be faithful to the Gospel.

Pope Francis: Lent comes providentially to awaken us, to shake us from our lethargy.

Mass Readings: If you wish to study the readings before or after Mass, they may be accessed from the parish website. See the heading on the homepage with links to readings of the day and readings of the next Sunday.
